Show Schedule Clarification

Where applicable, roses will be exhibited in alphabetical order

within each class. All general classes of specimen roses will follow these rules. Each named rose, within a class, will constitute its own variety. Judging will be against the merits for that variety. Judges may award ribbons for each separate rose variety if considered worthy. There can be one and only one blue ribbon awarded per variety. There are no mandatory awards. For example, Class 1 (Hybrid Teas) could include: Paradise; Peace; Peach Beauty; and Pristine. Judging each variety is on its own merits and ribbons are awarded accordingly. Only a single Paradise might be entered. It will be judged on its own merits and could receive a blue ribbon. American Rose Society (ARS) rules and regulations will govern. The Show Chairperson has the final decision for Show Schedule questions not covered by ARS regulations. Judges' decisions are final in determining the merits of roses and the awarding of ribbons. Colored dots indicating the decision of the judges will be used. Anyone wishing to receive a corresponding ribbon is entitled to do so upon request.

General Rules

- 1, Only amateur rose growers or arrangers are eligible to exhibit and compete for ribbons, certificates and keeper trophies. The exhibitor need not be a member of any rose organization.
- **2**. A commercial rose grower is eligible to exhibit roses and compete for prizes provided those roses are from his/her own personal garden which is not a part of their commercial business.
- 3. The grooming area will be open between 7:00 and 11:00 am on the show date. The grooming area must be cleared and vacated by 11:00 am. Entries are accepted only between 7:30 and 9:30 am.
- 4. The Placement Committee will make all placements unless specified otherwise.
- **5.** All exhibitors must be out of the show area by 9:30 am. During judging no persons other than judges, clerks, judge's chairperson, and Trophies/Awards chairperson are allowed in the show area.
- **6**. The Trophy/Awards Chairperson will check out all trophies. Exhibits, trophies and awards are not to be removed before 5:00 pm. without permission from the Show Chairman. Winner's may request Certificates from a Trophy Committee member on Saturday afternoon.
- **7**. All rose entries become property of the Ft. Worth Rose Society. The show committee may at any time remove an exhibit that has deteriorated to the point where it detracts from the quality of the show.
- 8. Containers and accessories, etc. should be out of sight and identified. We take special care to safeguard exhibits. However, the ARS, the Dallas Rose Society, Ft. Worth Rose Society, and Botanic Gardens are not responsible for: the loss of, or damage to, entries or property; nor for injuries to persons, not resulting from the direct act of their respective agents. Liability of any nature is hereby disclaimed.

Division I & II Rules

- 1. All entries must include a properly completed American Rose Societies entry tag. Entry tags are available at the show. Entries not in conformance with this schedule or rose show standards face disqualification.
- **2**. ALL EXHIBITORS MUST REGISTER and receive a exhibitor's registration number. Pre-registration is permitted by contacting the Horticultural Registration.
- 3. Collections requiring multiple separate containers will have one entry tag per container.
- **4**. Current ARS rules that establish type of rose shall prevail. Roses having two or more names in conflict, will use the ARS Exhibition name. Responsibility for proper Identification and classification lies totally with the exhibitor. Eligible rose varieties include those published in ARS:
- " Modern Roses 12" and Supplements
- " Handbook for Selecting Roses"
- " American Rose" magazine
- Combined Rose List

- **5.** Specimen blooms must be grown, cut and groomed by the exhibitor. **Only one person may exhibit from the family garden in the same class. Couples must enter as one exhibitor.** All entries must be outdoor grown
- **6.** The Ft. Worth Rose Society provides all containers except as noted below. This includes: English boxes, brandy snifters and other special containers for specified collection classes furnished on a first-co basis.
- 7. Specimen blooms must be disbudded for Hybrid Tea, Grandiflora and other exhibition types shown, except for single-flowered and semi-double varieties. All other types are exhibited as naturally grown. More info in ARS Guidelines for Judging Rose.
- **8.** Only naturally grown foliage may be exhibited. Washing or wiping is permitted and encouraged. No oil, lacquer, dressing, or artificial treatment is allowed.
- 9. Polyethylene film, aluminum foil, or foam wedges are permitted in he necks of vases.
- **10**. Entries receiving a blue ribbon may qualify for an ARS, FWRS Certificate, or Keeper Trophy. Judging is in accordance with ARS rules.
- 11. Disqualification of entries will be made for:
 - a) Misnamed, misclassified, or mislabeled.
 - b) Unlabeled entries and entries not containing a registration number
 - c) Stem on stem: Specimen roses exhibited with a portion of a previous stem growth attached, except for Old Garden Roses and Victorian Roses.
 - d) Presence of a foreign substance applied to the foliage, stem, or bloom to enhance appearance.
 - e) Side bud(s) on a specimen requiring disbudding.
 - f) The exhibitor's name in any location other than the designated places on the entry tag.
 - **g)** A specimen otherwise in violation of any American Rose Society rule, or in conflict with this schedule.
- 12. Exhibitors may enter only a single rose per Specimen Class and a single entry per Challenge Class. Exhibitors placing more than a single specimen of the same cultivar, or more than one entry per any Challenge or Collection class automatically disqualifies all their entries in that class, except as specifically noted.
- **13**. No family member of a judge for this show may exhibit. No judge, for this show, may exhibit except in those classes specifically designated "JUDGES."
- **14.** Awards, trophies and certificates awarded in Divisions I and II will be based on blue ribbons only. Red ribbons will be considered in case of a tie on the Sweepstakes award.
- **15.** The Novice classes are open only to those rose growers who have never won a first place ribbon in the horticulture division of an ARS accredited rose show. Exhibitors may enter Novice and regular competitive classes, but may not enter the same variety in both classes.
- **16.** The bouquet classes can use additional plant materials for filler but the judging criteria will be the roses entered.

The Decorative Hybrid Tea does not normally present exhibition form and instead of a symmetrical spiral of petals, may also display a more informal configuration.

CLASS 8 - Polyantha Spray

All Polyanthas (POL) varieties are eligible. One stem with multiple blooms.

CLASS 9 - Climbers

Only those varieties classified as Large-Flowered Climbers (LCI), Hybrid Wichuraiana (Hwich), or Hybrid Gigantea (HG) are eligible. One bloom, with or without side buds, or one spray.

FWRS Certificate & Gift Certificate

CLASS 10 - Classic Shrubs

Only those varieties with Hybrid Musk (HMsk), Hybrid Rugosa (HRg), Hybrid Moyesii (HMoy), or Hybrid Kordesii (HKor) are eligible. One bloom, with or without side buds, or one spray.

ARS Best Classic Shrub Certificat

CLASS 11 - Modern Shrubs

Only those varieties classified as a Shrub (S) are eligible. One bloom, with or without side buds, or one spray.

FWRS Certificate & Gift Certificate

DIVISION I —SECTION C Old Garden Roses

CLASS 12 - Species

Only those varieties classified as a species (SP) are eligible. One bloom, with or without side buds, or one spray.

CLASS 13 - Dowager Queen

Any old garden rose variety introduced prior to 1867. Entry tag must show date of introduction. One bloom, with or without side buds, or one spray.

CLASS 14 - Victorian Rose

Any old garden rose variety that was introduced in 1867 or later. Entry tag must show date of introduction. One bloom, with or without side buds, or one spray.

- CLASS 15: Earthkind: Single stem in provided vase. Certificate
- CLASS 16: Novice Class: For exhibitors who have never won a blue ribbon in a horticultural class at a rose show conducted under the rules of the ARS. Blue ribbon winners are eligible for the Courts or other higher awards .—1 stem from a largerose.

CLASS 17: Junior Class: For junior exhibitors age 15 years or younger. Exhibitor's age must be on the entry tag. Entries to be placed alphabetically. Exhibitors can enter any number of entries, but only one entry of a given variety.- 1 stem from a large rose.

CLASS 18: SEEDLINGS/SPORTS Large Rose: A seedling is a specimen derived from an cross made by the exhibitor. A sport is a natural mutation of a mother plant that has been propagated. For a sport the class and variety of the mother plant should be listed on the entry tag. Registered varieties are not eligible. One specimen, one bloom-per-stem or spray. Any type of large rose.

CLASS 19: JUDGE's Large Rose; For Judges judging in this rose show. Any number of entries may be made, provided each is a different variety. One stem with one bloom or spray.

SECTION CC- Misc. Mini & Miniflora

CLASS 28 - Judge's Miniature or Miniflora: One stem with one bloom or spray. **For Judges** judging in this rose show. Any number of entries may be made, provided each is a different variety.

ARS Certificate & Keeper Trophy

CLASS 29 - Small Rose Seedling or Sport: A seedling is a specimen derived from an cross made by the exhibitor.

A sport is a natural mutation of a mother plant that has been propagated. For a sport the class and variety of the mother plant should be listed on the entry tag. Register varieties are not eligible. One specimen, one bloom-perstem or spray. Any type of small rose.

CLASS 30: Novice Class: For exhibitors who have never won a blue ribbon in a horticultural class at a rose show conducted under the rules of the ARS. Blue ribbon winners are eligible for the Courts or other higher awards ARS certificate & Plant

CLASS 31: Junior Class (15 & under): For junior exhibitors age 15 years or younger. Exhibitor's age must be on the entry tag. Entries to be placed alphabetically. Exhibitors can enter any number of entries, but only one entry of a given variety.- 1 stem from a large rose.

DIVISION III -- ARRANGEMENTS

GUIDELINES - By entering this show, exhibitors agree to abide by ARS Guidelines for Judging Rose Arrangements and the rules stated in this schedule. One entry per exhibitors allowed in each class, but an exhibitor may enter as many classes as desired. More than one exhibitor from the same garden may enter the same class. Question regarding the schedule should be directed to: Larry Wiley, 817.343.5618; email larry-wiley@att.net.

TIMES - All exhibitors, including judges, must pre-register their entries by Wednesday, April 20, 2016, by contacting Larry Wiley (info above). Entries must be in place by 9:30 a.m. on April 23 and remain until 4:00 p.m. April 24, unless permission for removal is given by the arrangements chairperson. All reasonable care will be taken to safeguard exhibits, but neither the Ft. Worth Rose Society nor the Dallas Rose Society assumes any liability for loss or damage of any nature.

ARRANGEMENTS - Roses must be the dominant flower in all arrangements. All roses must be outdoor garden grown and correctly named on the entry tag according to the ARS Approved Exhibition Name. Flowers other than roses and dried and/or treated dried plant material are allowed unless prohibited in the schedule. "AG" must be written on the entry tag if roses are arranger-grown so that the entry will be eligible for an ARS high award. A card of intent may be included with an arrangement as an explanation of the arranger's interpretation of the theme or class title unless the schedule specifically forbids it.

RESTRICTIONS - There are two causes for disqualification of an arrangement: Roses not outdoor grown and use of artificial plant material. Other components NOT allowed are: painted or dyed fresh plant materials, living creatures, electrical devices, plant materials on the state conservation list, and the American flag or flags of any country used in an arrangement or as a decoration in any way. Accessories are allowed unless stated otherwise in the schedule. No one but the exhibitor may touch or move an arrangement. However, in special circumstances, if all efforts to locate the exhibitor have failed, the arrangement chairman may carefully move an

STAGING INFORMATION - Staging will be on tables covered with white cloth. Exhibitors may provide their own freestanding background *as an integral component of the design (subject to width and depth* limitations). 32"h x 19"w backboards for Standard arrangements and 9.5"h x 9.5"w backboards for Mini/Miniflora arrangements are available from the FWRS, but must be requested at the time of preregistration.

STANDARD SIZE ARRANGEMENTS - There is no restriction, except as specified in the schedule, as to the type of rose that may be used in a Standard size arrangement. The arrangement is not to exceed 24" in width or depth. No restrictions in height.

MINIATURE SIZE ARRANGEMENTS – These classes are to include Miniflora and/or Miniature rose varieties only. The arrangement is not to exceed 10" in height, width, or depth.

JUDGING AND AWARDS – Judging will be in accordance with the current ARS Guidelines for Judging Rose Arrangements. An arrangement incorrectly placed in a class will be judged in the class in which it is placed. All decisions of the judges are final.

ARS scorecard will be used to evaluate all entries:

15 points – CONFORMANCE – roses correctly named, type of design, other specific requirements of the schedule (e.g., size, materials, etc.)

30 points – DESIGN – all principles: balance, dominance, contrast, proportion, scale.

30 points - PERFECTION OF ROSES - and condition of other materials.

15 points – CREATIVITY AND EXPRESSIVENESS

10 points – DISTINCTION – uniqueness—what sets the design apart; i.e., its superiority, uniqueness, technical construction.

100 points – TOTAL

ARS certificate awards will be granted only where merited. ARS certificates may be given to eligible first-place winners scoring 92 points or more. Each class will have only one first place award. Blue ribbon winners in the large rose section will be considered for large medal certificates and blue ribbon winners in the small rose section will be considered for small medal certificates.

1st place requires 90 points minimum

2nd place requires 85 points minimum

3rd place requires 80 points minimum

DIVISION V PUBLIC JUDGED

Public judged EXPO (classes 43-44) will be judged by the public. Each visitor will receive 4 public judging stars. Each entry will be accompanied by a public judged entry tag. The entry in a class with the most stars will be Queen of the class. The next most stars in a class will be King. **A child under 16 will receive a prize in each class**. All entrants will receive Certificates.
